### Cycle of Life

At each site, there will be a game volunteer recognizable by means of their UDC lanyard/badges. Ask them for a clue, they'll give it to you. Solve. When you think you know the answer, write it down on your answer sheet and show it to the volunteer. If you're right, they'll give you a mini-puzzle which also includes directions to find the next major puzzle.

If you are picking up your puzzles or showing your answer, feel free to interrupt if the volunteer is giving a hint to another team. Teams picking up clues or confirming answers have priority over teams asking for hints.

#### Hints

If you are stuck on a puzzle or not having fun, you can ask the volunteer at that puzzle site for a hint. Give the volunteer your answer sheet so that they can note down that you took a hint on this puzzle.

### At 3:30PM, go to Mel's / Game End

If you finish the game before 3:30 P.M., congratulations. You're already at the game's end location, Mel's Diner.

At 3:30 P.M., our volunteers will pack up, leave the clue sites and go to the end-gathering, which is at Mel's diner at Shattuck and Kittredge.

We will accept answer sheets until 4:00 P.M.

You can order food if you like—you pay for your own. Or you can just wait for the game volunteers to announce winners at 5 P.M.

### Scoring / Ranking

Answer sheets must be turned in by 4pm. Team rankings for BANG 19 will be determined by:

- 1. Number of puzzles solved (8 max)
- 2. In case of a tie, number of hints taken
- 3. In case of a tie, number of minis solved
- 4. In case of a tie, finishing time

If past BANGs are any indication, there will be a few teams who solve all puzzles while taking no hints.
